DEFINITION

- ★ Create a bird song playlist to help memorize calls.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Relying solely on color, ignoring size and shape.
- ✗ Confusing similar species due to lack of attention to detail.
- ✗ Not considering seasonal changes in bird appearance.
