DEFINITION

- Practice your strategy with friends to refine your approach.
- Arrive early to familiarize yourself with the venue.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym RSTS (Rules, Strategy, Time, Sportsmanship) to remember key concepts.
- ★ Visualize a chess clock to remember time management.
- ★ Think of networking as 'connecting the dots' with other players.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Not reading the rulebook thoroughly before the tournament.
- ✗ Failing to adapt strategies based on opponents' moves.
- ✗ Neglecting to practice time management during matches.
