DEFINITION

Composition in calligraphy refers to the arrangement of letters and elements on a page. It enhances the visual appeal and readability of your work.

KEY CONCEPTS

Balance

Ensure that elements are evenly distributed to create a harmonious look.

White Space

Incorporate empty space around text to improve clarity and focus.

Contrast

Use differing colors and sizes to make elements stand out and enhance readability.

Hierarchy

Use size and placement to emphasize important elements, guiding the viewer's eye.

Alignment

Align text and elements consistently to create a cohesive design.

EXAMPLES

- Center-align a quote for emphasis.
- Use larger letters for the title and smaller for the body text.
- Leave margins around the edges for a clean look.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think 'B-HAC' for Balance, Hierarchy, Alignment, Contrast.
- ★ Visualize a balanced scale to remember the importance of balance.
- ★ Remember 'Less is More' for effective use of white space.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Overcrowding the page with too much text.
- ✗ Neglecting alignment, leading to a chaotic appearance.
- ✗ Ignoring white space, making the design feel cramped.
