DEFINITION

Enrichment involves providing activities and stimuli that engage a cat's natural instincts. It helps improve their physical and mental well-being.

KEY CONCEPTS

Physical Enrichment

Activities that promote movement, like climbing structures or interactive toys.

Mental Stimulation

Puzzles and games that challenge a cat's problem-solving skills and curiosity.

Sensory Enrichment

Introducing new scents, sounds, and textures to stimulate a cat's senses.

Social Interaction

Engaging with your cat through play or training to strengthen your bond.

Environmental Enrichment

Creating a stimulating living space with hiding spots, perches, and safe exploration areas.

EXAMPLES

- Use a feather wand to encourage play and exercise.
- Set up a puzzle feeder to make mealtime more engaging.
- Create a cozy nook with boxes and blankets for hiding and resting.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'PEMS' for Physical, Environmental, Mental, and Social enrichment.
- ★ Visualize a happy cat playing with a toy to recall enrichment benefits.
- ★ Associate each type of enrichment with a color: Physical (green), Mental (blue), etc.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to rotate toys, leading to boredom.
- ✗ Overlooking the importance of safe exploration areas.
- ✗ Not recognizing signs of stress or boredom in cats.
