- ★ Use the phrase 'Involved Parents, Successful Kids' to remember the importance.
- ★ Visualize a tree: roots (support) grow strong branches (children's success).

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Assuming teachers will communicate everything without follow-up.
- ✗ Not prioritizing time for educational activities at home.
- ✗ Over-involvement that may overwhelm the child.
