DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Positive Reinforcement

Consistency

Using the same commands and rewards consistently helps dogs understand what is expected of them.

Short Sessions

Socialization

Exposing dogs to different environments and other animals helps them become well-rounded and obedient.

EXAMPLES

- Reward your dog with treats when they sit on command.
- Practice 'stay' by gradually increasing the distance you move away from your dog.
- Use a clicker to mark the moment your dog performs the desired behavior.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think 'RCCS' for training: Reward, Consistency, Commands, Short sessions.
- ★ Visualize a dog sitting when you say 'sit' to reinforce the command.
- ★ Associate each command with a hand signal for better recall.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Inconsistency in commands can confuse the dog.
- ✗ Training for too long can lead to boredom and frustration.
- ✗ Failing to reward immediately can weaken the connection between behavior and reward.
