DEFINITION

- ★ Visualize a happy dog receiving treats to remember positive reinforcement.
- ★ Associate training sessions with fun and rewards to keep motivation high.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rewarding unwanted behaviors by mistake.
- ✗ Delaying rewards, which confuses the dog.
- ✗ Inconsistency in commands or rewards, leading to confusion.
