DEFINITION

Letter formation refers to how letters are shaped and written. Good letter formation is essential for clear and legible handwriting.

KEY CONCEPTS

Uppercase Letters

Uppercase letters are larger and often used at the beginning of sentences or names.

Lowercase Letters

Lowercase letters are smaller and used in most writing; they have specific shapes and sizes.

Strokes and Curves

Each letter is made up of basic strokes and curves; mastering these is key to good formation.

Spacing

Proper spacing between letters and words is crucial for readability and neatness.

Consistency

Consistent size and shape of letters help create a uniform look in handwriting.

EXAMPLES

- Writing 'A' with a pointed top and straight lines.
- Forming 'b' with a straight line and a rounded bottom.
- Spacing 'cat' evenly with gaps between each letter.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think of letters as shapes; visualize their outlines.
- ★ Use finger tracing in the air to remember letter movements.
- ★ Create a song or rhyme for tricky letters like 'g' and 'j'.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Mixing uppercase and lowercase letters inappropriately.
- ✗ Inconsistent letter sizes leading to a messy appearance.
- ✗ Poor spacing that makes words hard to read.
