DEFINITION

Electrical basics involve understanding how electricity works and how to safely handle it in home repairs. This knowledge is essential for performing simple electrical tasks safely and effectively.

KEY CONCEPTS

Voltage

Voltage is the electrical force that pushes current through a circuit, measured in volts.

Current

Current is the flow of electric charge in a circuit, measured in amperes (amps).

Resistance

Resistance is the opposition to the flow of current, measured in ohms, affecting how much current flows.

Circuit Types

There are series and parallel circuits; series circuits have one path for current, while parallel circuits have multiple paths.

Safety Precautions

Always turn off power before working on electrical systems and use insulated tools to prevent shocks.

EXAMPLES

- Replacing a light switch safely.
- Installing a new outlet in a wall.
- Changing a blown fuse in a circuit.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'VIR' for Voltage, Current, Resistance.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Not turning off the power before starting work.
- ✗ Confusing series and parallel circuits.
- ✗ Using the wrong tools for electrical tasks.
