DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

- Combining gold and deep blue for a striking contrast.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'ROYGBIV' for the color spectrum to recall primary and secondary colors.
- ★ Think of warm colors as 'sunset' and cool colors as 'ocean' to visualize their effects.
- ★ Use the phrase 'complementary colors complete' to remember how to pair colors effectively.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Ignoring the color wheel and choosing colors randomly.
- ✗ Overusing too many contrasting colors, leading to a chaotic design.
- ✗ Neglecting the impact of lighting on color perception.
