MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'Candid, Composition, Light' as CCL for key elements.
- ★ Visualize a story with each photo to enhance narrative focus.
- ★ Use the acronym 'RLS' for Respect, Light, Story.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Focusing too much on technical settings instead of the moment.
- ✗ Ignoring the background, which can distract from the subject.
- ✗ Not approaching subjects respectfully, leading to uncomfortable situations.
