DEFINITION

Logic puzzles are brain games that require reasoning to solve. They often involve deducing information from given clues.

KEY CONCEPTS

Deductive Reasoning

This is the process of drawing specific conclusions from general statements or premises.

Syllogisms

A form of reasoning where a conclusion is drawn from two given or assumed propositions.

Grid Method

A visual tool that helps organize information and relationships in a structured format.

Elimination

The strategy of removing impossible options to narrow down possible solutions.

Clue Analysis

Carefully examining each clue to understand its implications and how it relates to others.

EXAMPLES

- If A is taller than B and B is taller than C, who is the tallest?
- In a group of friends, if John is older than Sarah and Sarah is older than Mike, who is the youngest?
- If the red car is faster than the blue car, and the blue car is faster than the green car, which is the slowest?

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use acronyms to remember key strategies like D.E.C. (Deduction, Elimination, Clue Analysis).
- ★ Visualize a grid to keep track of relationships and eliminate options.
- ★ Practice with simple puzzles to build confidence and familiarity with logic patterns.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing to conclusions without analyzing all clues.
- ✗ Ignoring the relationships between different clues.
- ✗ Failing to keep track of eliminated options in complex puzzles.
